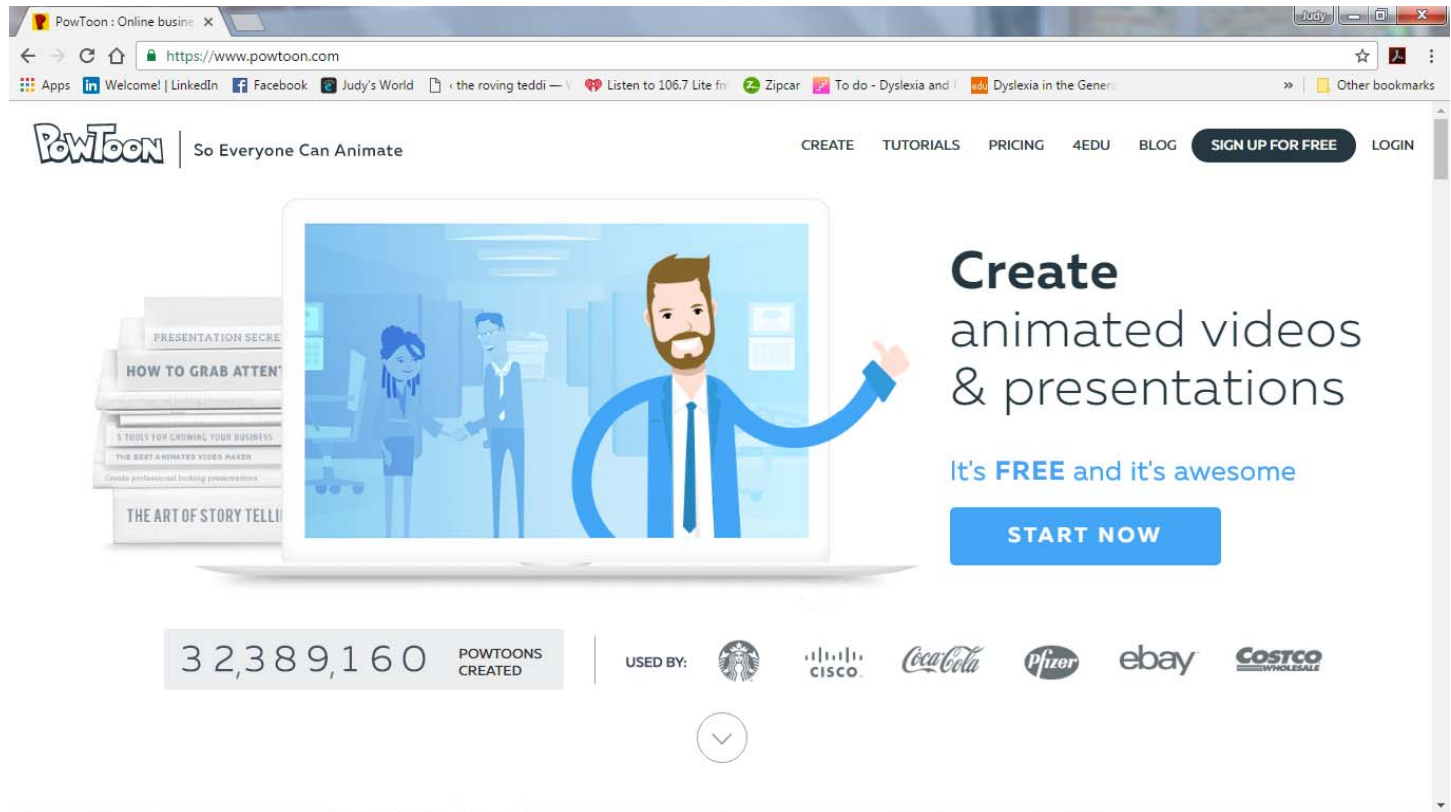


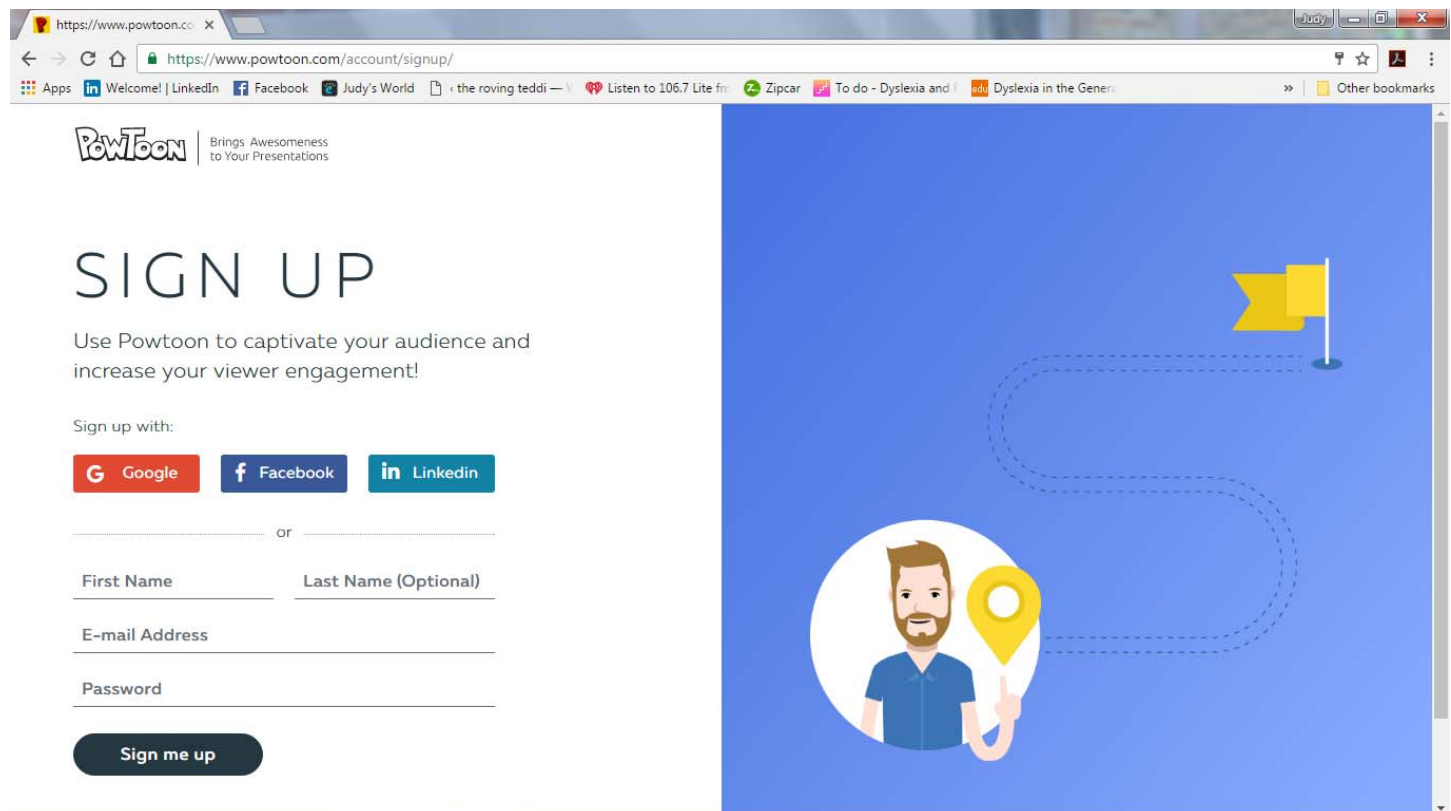
How to use Powtoons...

Begin by going to <https://www.powtoons.com>.

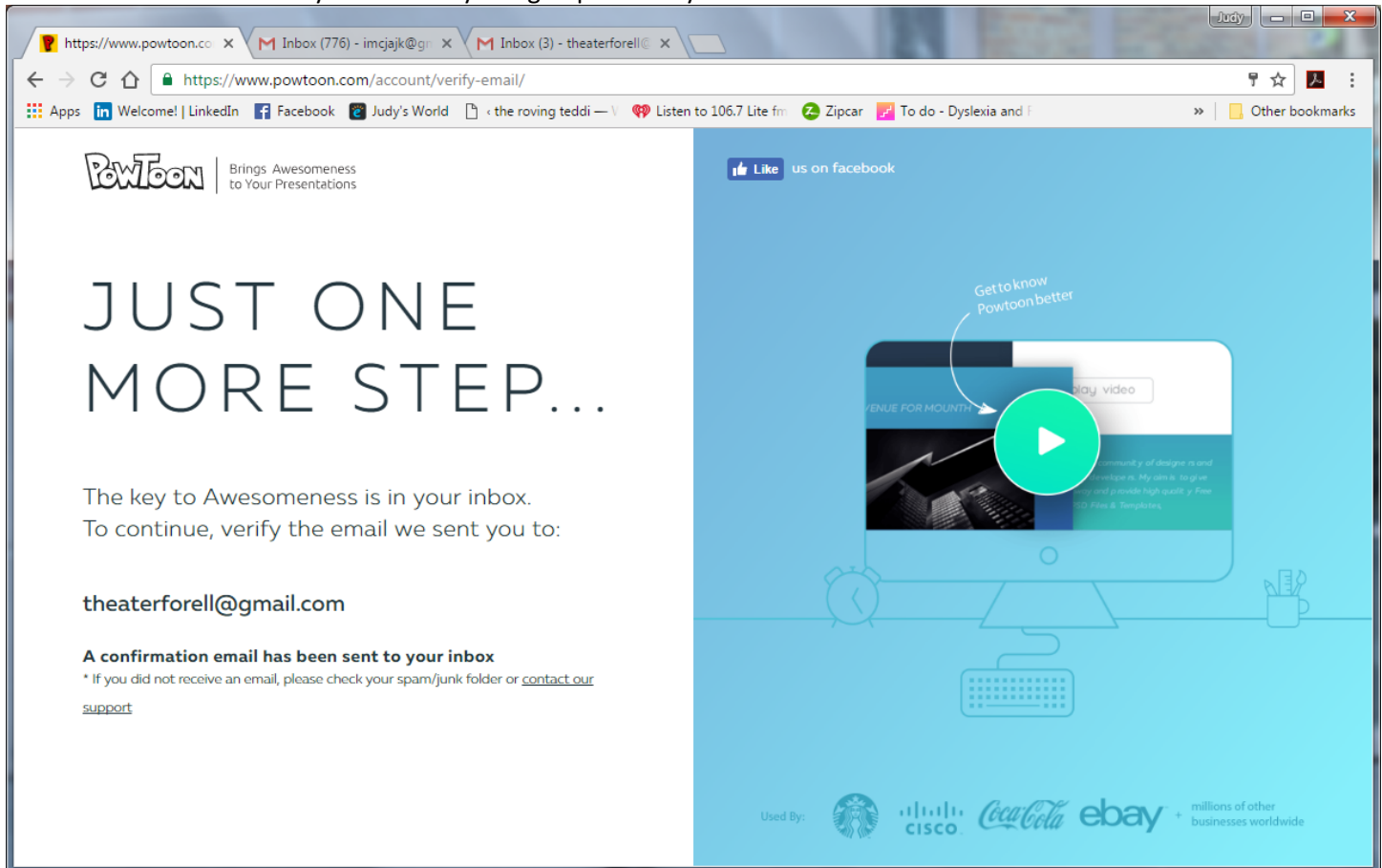
In the upper right corner is a "Sign Up For Free" button.



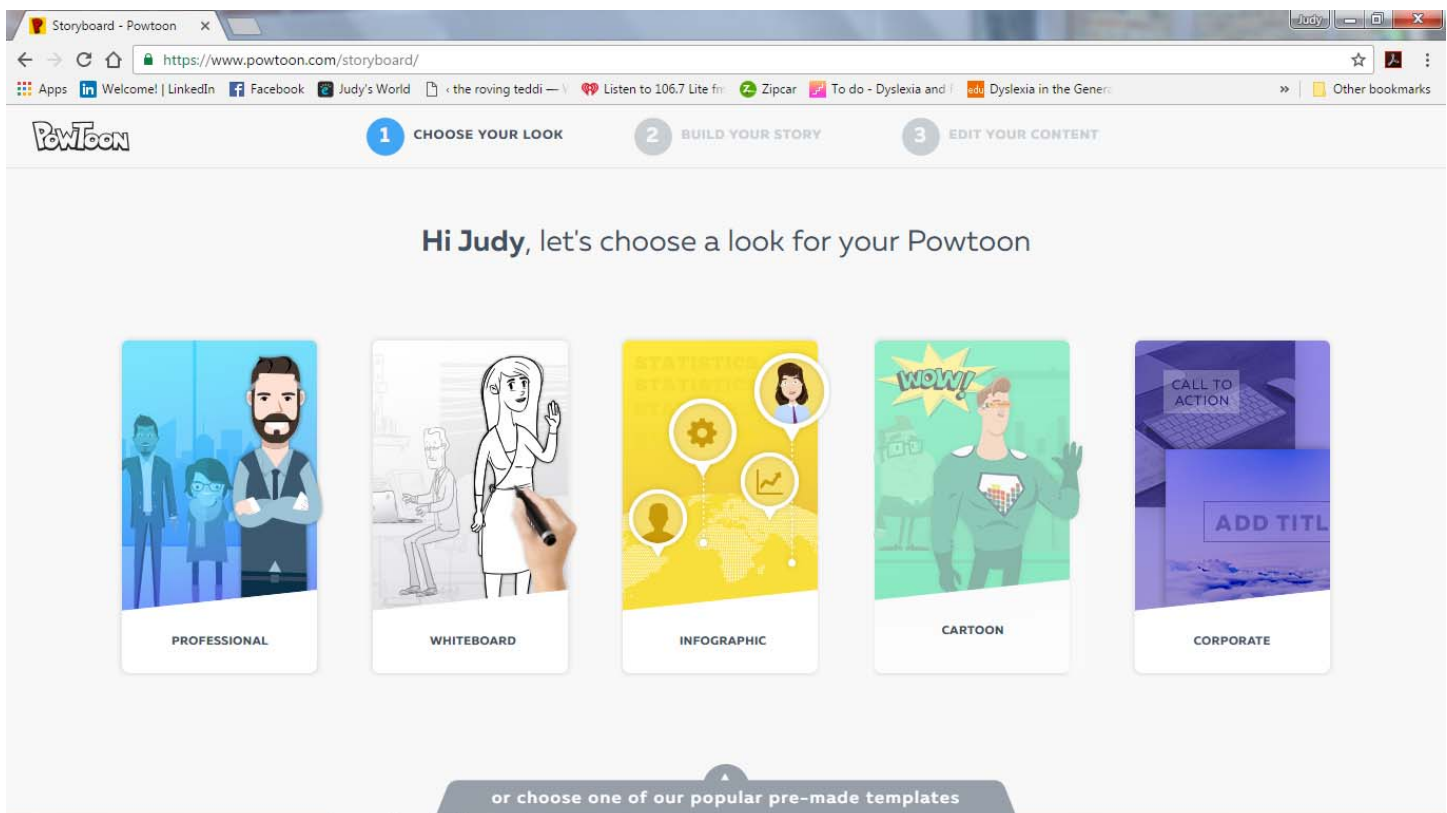
There are many ways to sign up. You can use your Facebook, Google, Linkedin or Email account.



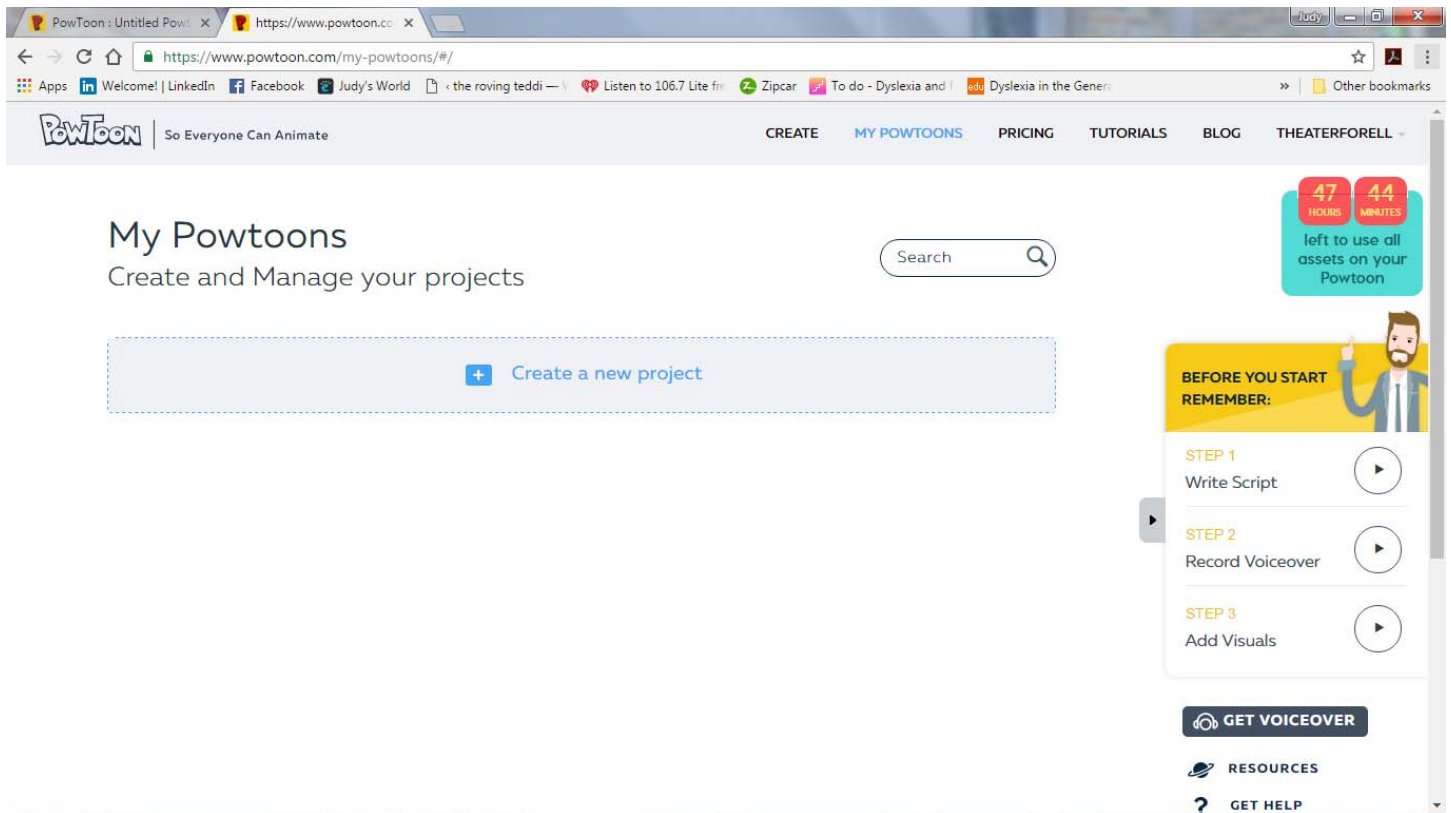
You will need to reconfirm your email if you sign up that way. ☺



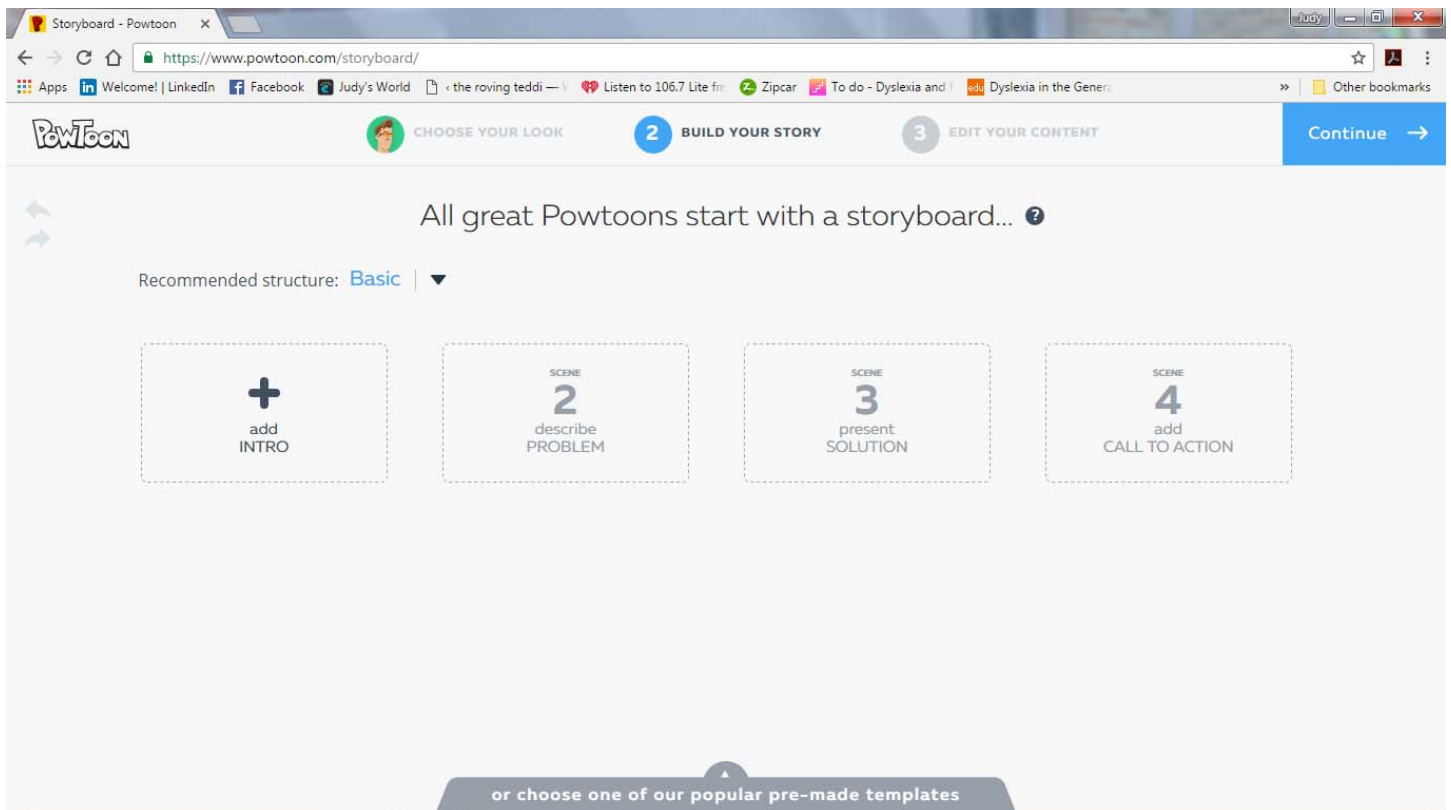
Your opening screen...



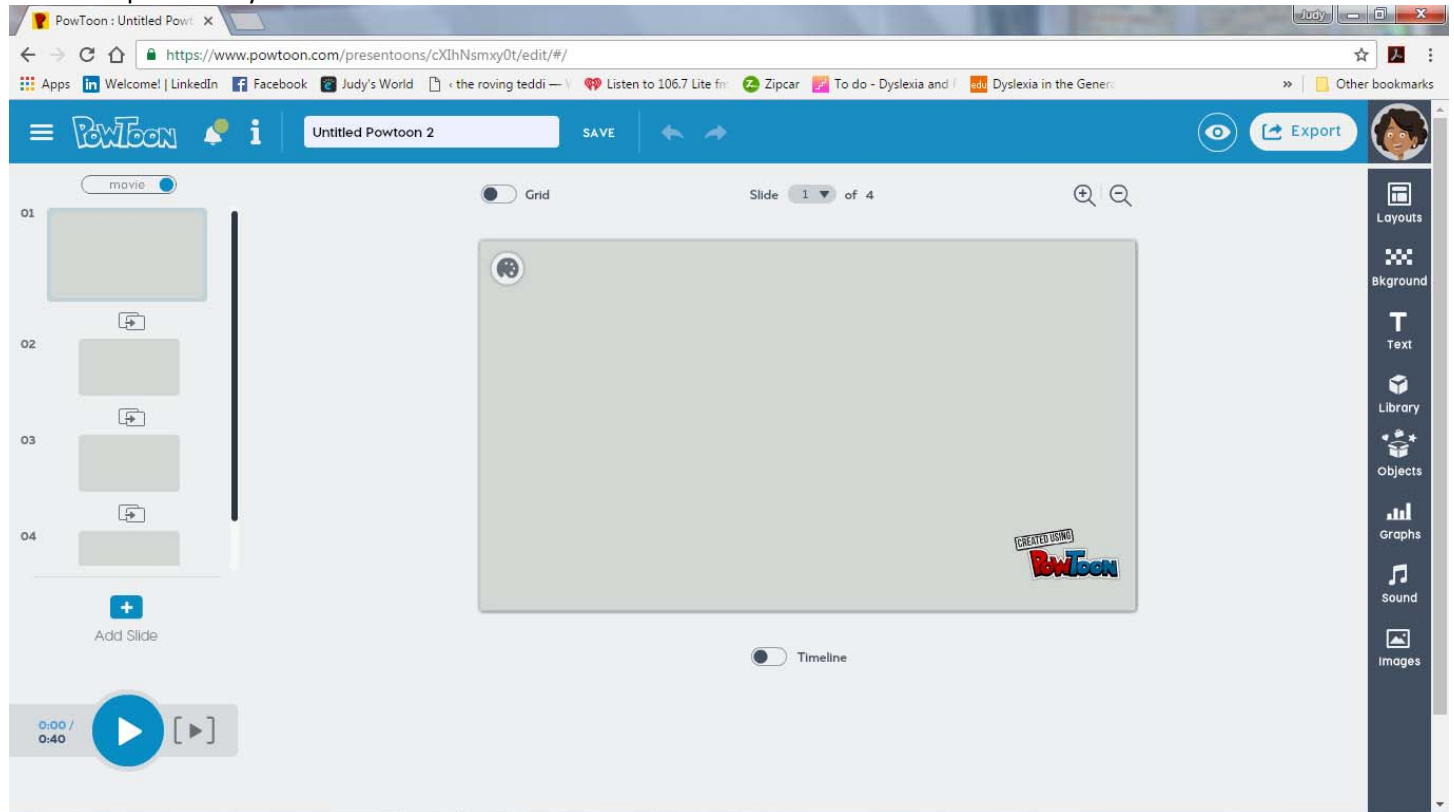
Click on **"Powtoon"** in the upper left corner. This will take you to your dashboard where you find everything you need! This is where you will find any Powtoons you have made or are working on. Here you can click the **Tutorials** tab for some *quick tutorials on using the program* or click on **Create** and begin.



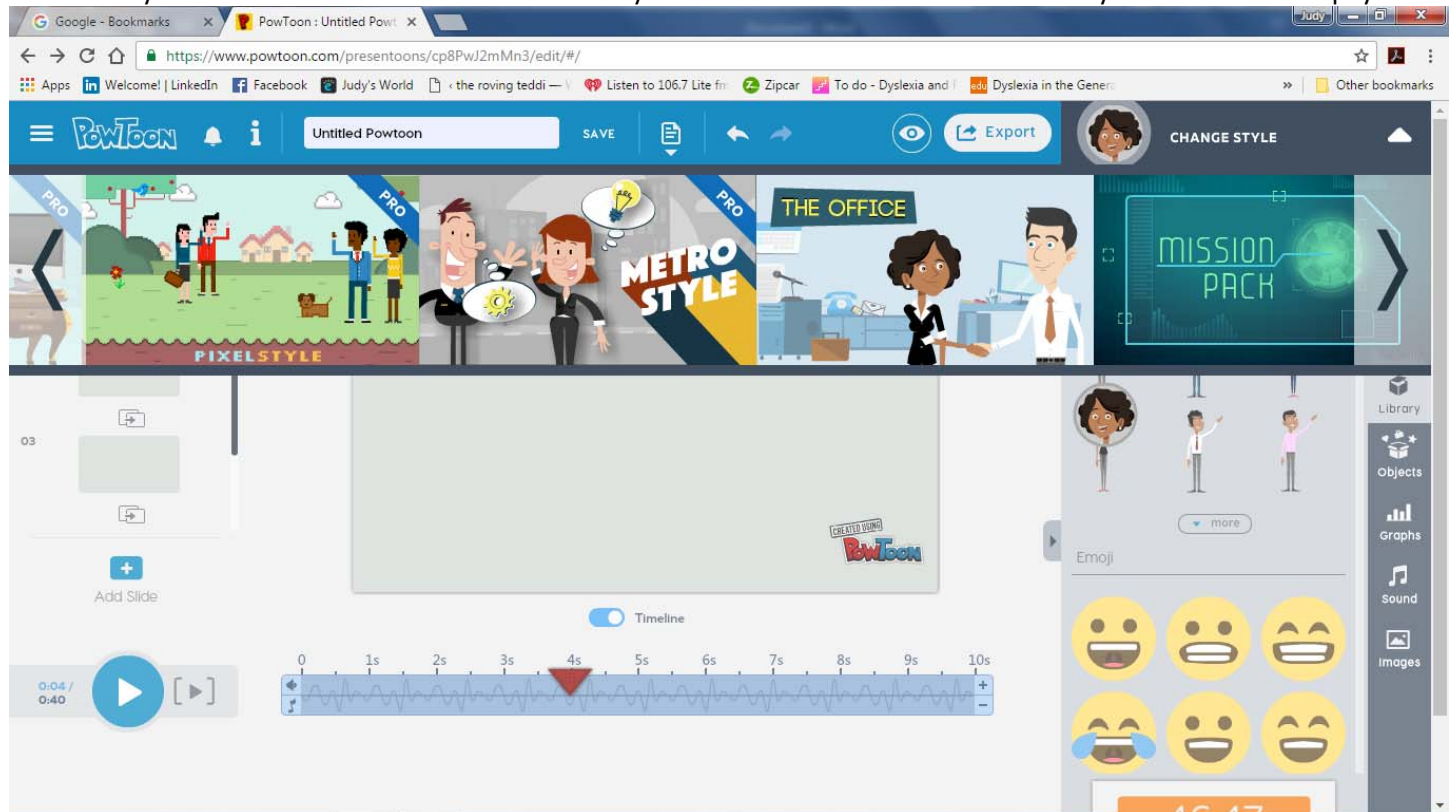
Time to **Create!** Choose *whiteboard*... Then click on **"Continue"** in the upper right corner.



This will open a storyboard.



Begin by clicking on the picture in the upper right corner of your window. This will give you a drop down scroll of different styles to choose from. CAUTION: Choose styles that DO NOT HAVE "PRO" labels if you do not want to pay.



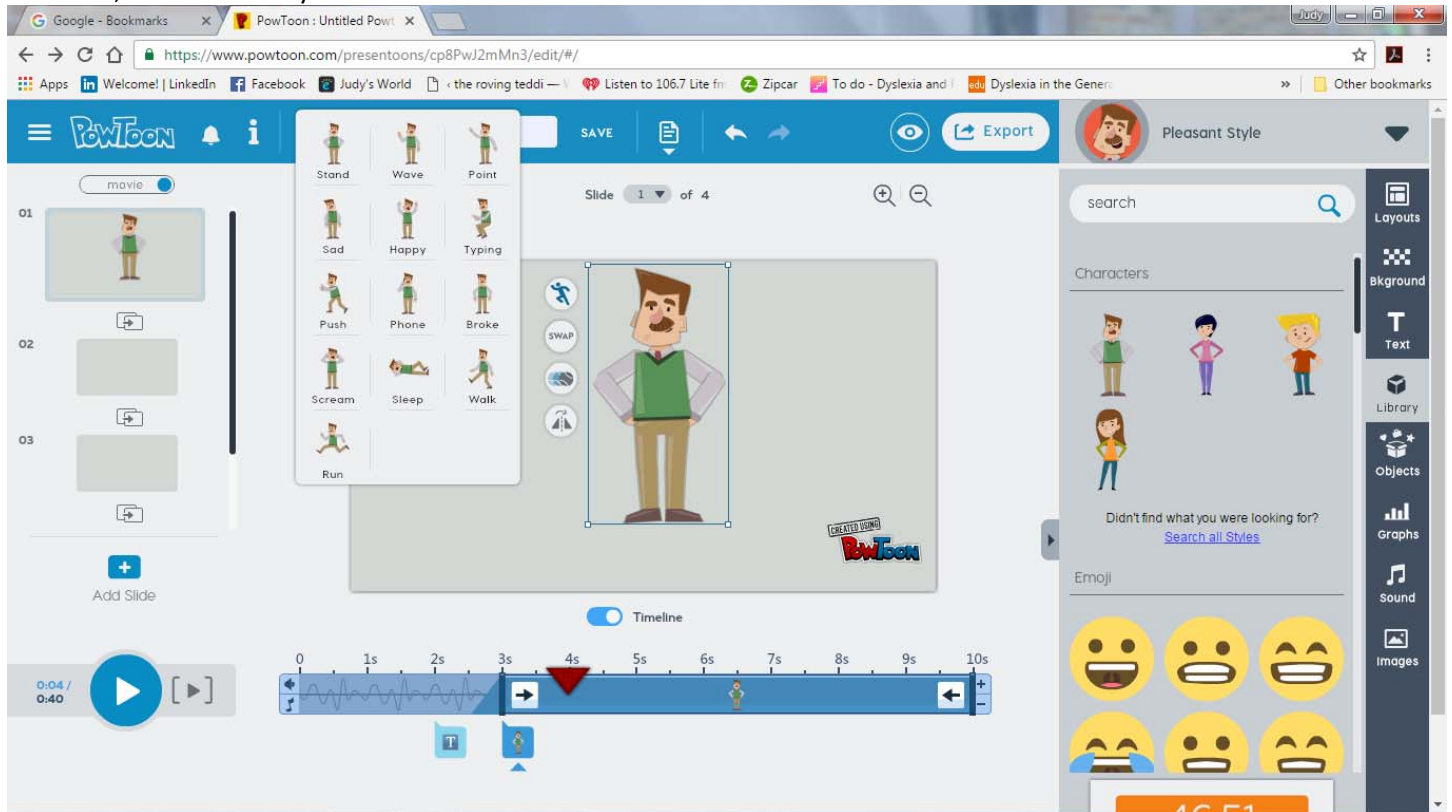
On the right side are all the tools, images, and elements that you can drag and drop.

Library will open the library of characters.

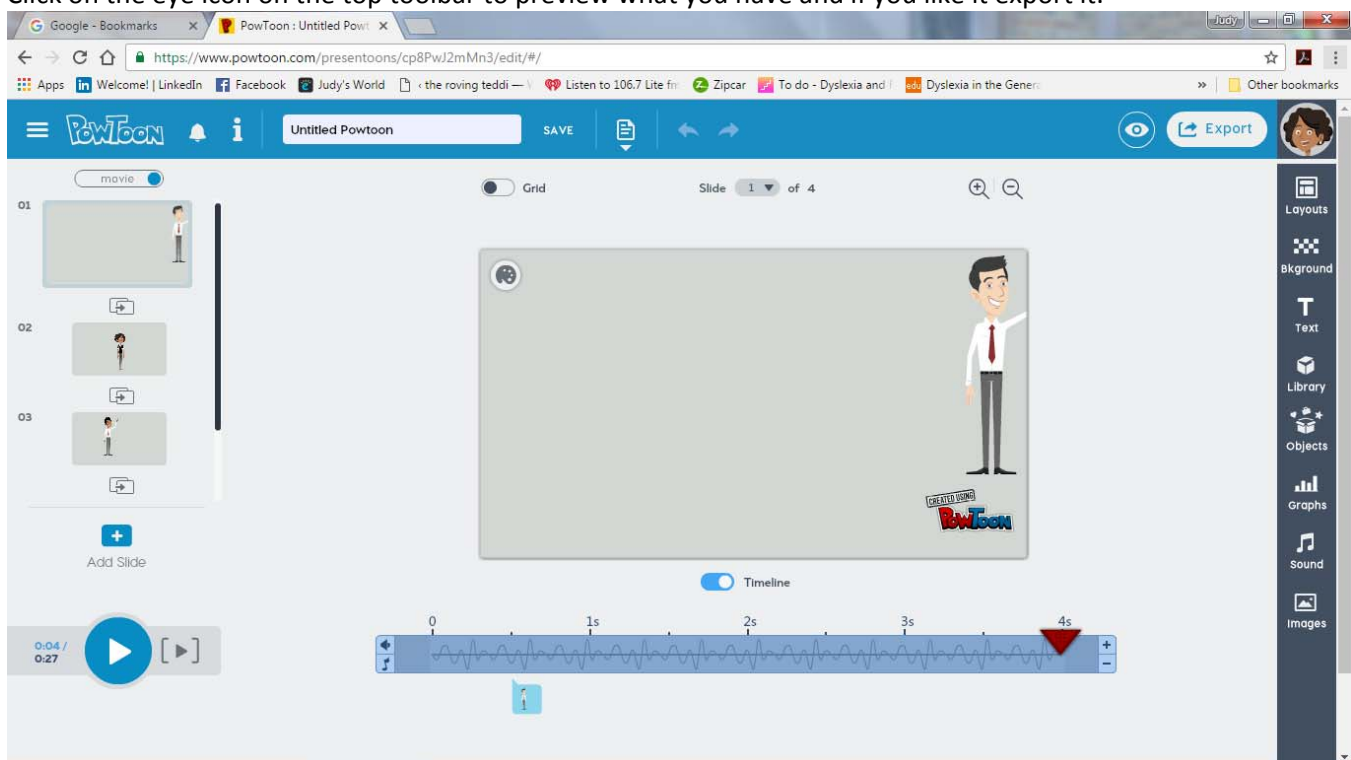
You will be prompted to turn on timeline. Click on. Turning on the Timeline can be alternately done with the small switch under the slide. This will preload an audio file. That can be changed by clicking on the music note icon at the very beginning of the first slide or shut off by clicking the on/off icon above the note.

NOTE: Any object that has an icon of a lock on it, do not use unless you wish to pay. They are copyright protected.

However, there are many that are not.



Click on the eye icon on the top toolbar to preview what you have and if you like it export it.



You can export to Powtoons site or Youtube or to an MP4 format. Have fun!
