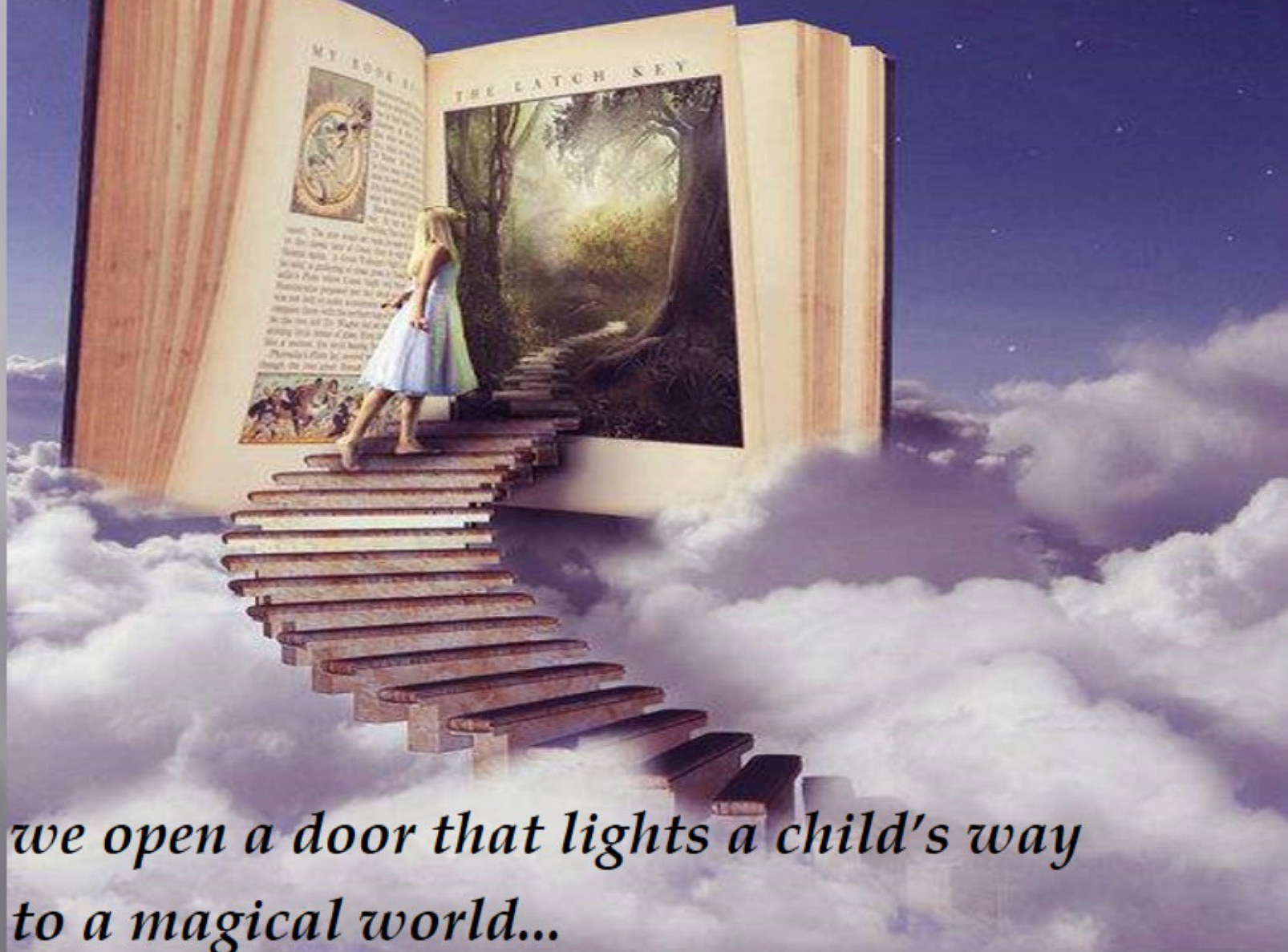

are some Critical Predictors
of success in learning to read?

- **Phonemic awareness**
- **Phonological understanding**
- **Background Knowledge**

Why?

It results in...

- Reading Fluency
- Increased Vocabulary
- Reading Comprehension

How?

- **Systematic & Explicit Instruction**
- **Multisensory Activity**
- **Exposure to additional
Background Knowledge**

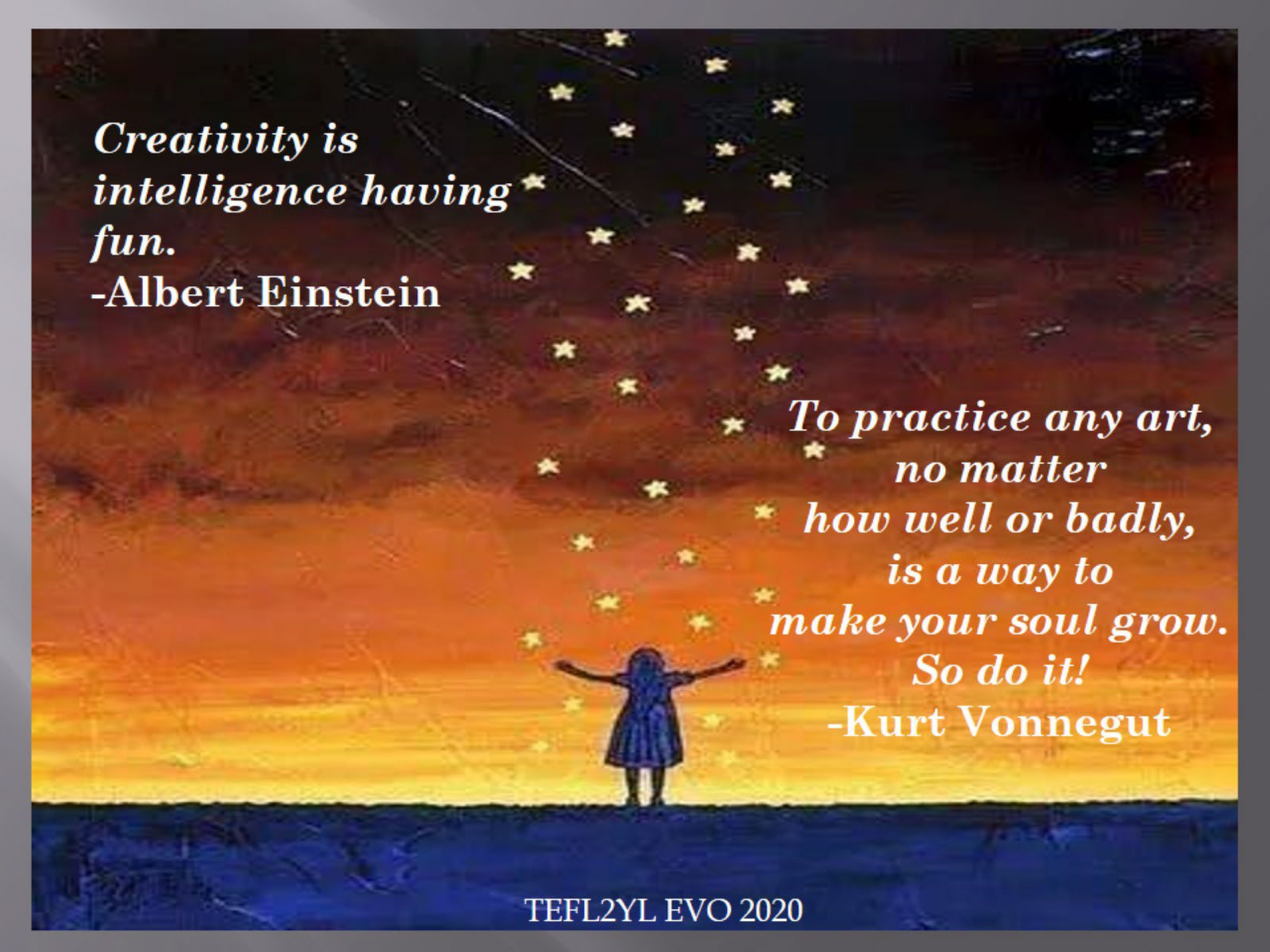
